Only horses which have been claimed with Racing Victoria's Off The Track Program are eligible for these prizes.



Important Qualification Notes

- At least one qualifying score **MUST** have been obtained by the nominated Horse/Pony Rider combination.
- If there is a rider change, this applies to the new Horse/Pony Rider combination also.
- To enter, you must have at least one score which is at or above the required percentage for the level you are entering.
- Only one HC (non-competitive) score is allowed to count at each level entered.
- If a class is oversubscribed, horses will be accepted based on their three best scores. A reserve list will be posted.





Qualification Requirements

All entries for EA and FEI Level tests must be qualified by having gained at least the following during the 12-month period preceding the closing date.

Pacific League World Cup Final Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the PAL Final, combinations must have competed at a CDIW qualifier or CDI3* or higher on at least one (1) occasion in the preceding twelve (12) months and gained a minimum of at least 68% in the Grand Prix Freestyle to Music.

Field and Allocation

The Pacific League Final will consist of a maximum of fifteen (15) eligible combinations. Up to five (5) places will be reserved for visiting combinations. In the event the visiting NF requests more than five (5) places, the Chairman of Dressage from each NF or their nominated representative will determine the numbers from each country based on performance in the preceding twelve (12) months. Host NF-qualified combinations may complete the field.

Horse and Athlete Requirements

At the Pacific League Final, an Athlete may ride two (2) Horses in Grand Prix, however, must declare to the OC prior to the Grand Prix draw which of the two (2) Horses is their nominated choice for the Grand Prix Freestyle to Music. Only one (1) Horse per Athlete is permitted in the Grand Prix Freestyle to Music.

FEI Requirements & Registration

FEI Database Registration

All riders and horses participating must be registered on the FEI database. Registrations must be renewed each calendar year. EA collects the charges on behalf of the FEI. Registration forms are available on the EA web site: www.equestrian.org.au or contact the National Office. Please note that this registration is required.

FEI Passport Requirements

FEI passport not required if competing in rider's home country however horses/ponies must be registered with National Federation and have identifying documents. Riders must ensure that they have the appropriate documents on arrival. Enquiries: EA 02 8762 7777.



Ponies, Children, Junior and Young Rider Eligibility

The Pony Tests are open to riders from the year in which they reach the age of twelve (12) until the end of the year they reach the age of sixteen (16). Combinations must have achieved 60% or above on one (1) occasion in Official Elementary or in a FEI Pony competition to compete FEI Pony.

The Children Tests are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 12 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14. Combinations must have achieved 60% or above on one (1) occasion in Official Novice or in a FEI Children's competition to be eligible to compete in an FEI CDICH, as per rule 10.17.3 in the EA Dressage Rule Book.

The Junior Tests are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 14 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. Combinations must have achieved 60% or above on one (1) occasion in Official Medium or in a FEI Junior competition to compete FEIJ, as per rule 10.17.3 in the EA Dressage Rule Book.

The Young Rider Tests are open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21. Combinations must have achieved 60% or above on one (1) occasion in Official PSG/Inter 1 or in a FEI Young Rider competition to compete FEIY, as per rule 10.17.3 in the EA Dressage Rule Book.

Important Withdrawal Notice

Riders should be aware that the FEI considers any withdrawals without a valid excuse after the definite entry date as a serious offence, and may lead to the athlete losing their placing.

Horse Welfare

FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that **the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.**

1. Welfare in Preparation and Training

At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2. Fitness and Health Requirements

Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3. Event Management and Horse Welfare

Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Post-Competition Care and Retirement

Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. Education and Expertise

The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.

Withdrawals & Refunds

Withdrawal from Competition

No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours of its commencement without the permission of the OC. A written statement must be provided to the Secretary (Refer rule 10.4).

Refund Policy

Scratching/Withdrawals Before Closing Date:

Scratchings/withdrawals before the closing date will be refunded in full minus the administration fee.

Scratching/Withdrawals After Closing Date:

Entry fees will be refunded for scratching/withdrawals advised after the closing date up to (5) five days prior to the start of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be refunded with a valid vet or medical certificate. Entry fees refunds for scratchings/withdrawals received (5) five days or later before the start of the event will have 35% refunded.

Long Distance Competitor Refunds:

Refunds may be considered for withdrawals from competitors travelling long distances who are placed 5th or lower on the reserve list if the OC is notified 48 hours prior to the commencement of the class.

Other Fees:

Fees for stables/tack/cabins/camp sites will not be refunded for competitors who depart earlier than indicated on the entry form.

Event Cancellation

Equestrian Victoria (EV) or the Organising Committee (OC) may, at their sole discretion, cancel the event due to pandemic, catastrophic conditions, disease or force majeure, or for any other reason.

If the event is cancelled after it has commenced, no refunds will be issued.

If the event is cancelled prior to commencement, the entrant may be entitled to a partial refund of the entry fees paid.

Any such refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of Equestrian Victoria, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event. Entrants who have provided an email address and/or mobile phone number will be notified of event cancellation by email and/or text message.

The refund policy for withdrawal, scratchings or change of an entry is set out above.



Freestyle Details

Riders are required to confirm their intention to start in the freestyle should they qualify at the time of Accreditation at the Rider info office.

Freestyle Music: Details on procedure to submit freestyle music will be advised via our website.

Prize Money Details

The Organising Committee reserves the right to review the prize money allocation for competitions in line with EA

Dressage rules 3.20, specifically:

- **Fewer than three competitors:** Prize money will be paid to 1st place only.
- **Five competitors or fewer:** Prize money will be paid to 1st & 2nd place getters only.
- **Ten competitors and below:** Prize money will be paid to 3rd place getters only.

Goods in kind may replace prize money in some competitions. Prize money will be credited to competitors within 14 working days after the event via Electronic Funds Transfer. Please ensure you enter the correct bank details on the entry.

Championship Rug Awards

Championship Rugs will be presented as follows using the Championships point system (rule 3.19) unless otherwise advised:

- **Open Championship Awards:** Championships will be awarded in the following Levels: Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, and Advanced.
- **Pony Championship Awards:** Championships will be awarded in the following Levels: Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, Advanced and FEI Levels.



The Small Tour Champion will be determined by the highest combined results using the championship point score system in the Prix St George, Intermediate I and Intermediate I Freestyle.

The Medium Tour Champion will be determined by the highest combined results using the championship point score system in the Intermediate A, Intermediate B & Medium Tour Freestyle competitions.

The CDN Big Tour Champion will be determined by the highest combined results using the championship point score system in the FEI Intermediate II, FEI Grand Prix and Grand Prix Freestyle.

Para Dressage & Virtus: Rug awarded to highest percentage over all grades.

Off the Track Championship Awards: Championship will be awarded in the following levels: Preliminary, Novice, Elementary and Medium.

Trophy Awards

The Gert Donvig Memorial Trophy

Awarded to the highest placed Victorian in the Prix St Georges.

The CK Perpetual Trophy

Awarded to the highest percentage gained by a Victorian from all Grand Prix Classes.

The Statene Park Trophy

Awarded to the Rider aged 25 years of age and under with the highest percentage gained in an FEI Level.

Victorian AOR Outstanding Achievement Award

The award will be presented to AOR rider who achieves the highest weighted percentage score from one eligible test, with the weighting recognising the increasing degree of difficulty at higher levels.

Amateur Owner Riders (AOR)

The AOR Champion Horse and AOR Champion Pony in each class (Preliminary–Small Tour) will receive a special trophy. Trophies will only be awarded.

The 3 highest scores in each test (Horse and Pony) will be awarded. Competitors must tick the “Are you an AOR Competitor” at time of entry to be eligible.

Young Rider & Junior Rider Awards

Young Rider Awards (16–21 Years)

Medallion awarded to the highest placed Young Rider in all National Classes.

Junior Rider Awards (Under 16)

Medallion awarded to the highest placed Junior Rider in all National Classes.

Trophy Notes

All trophies will be held by Equestrian Victoria and a suitably engraved plaque will be given to winners. There will be an opportunity for photos to be taken with the trophy following presentations.

Protest Procedures

Any appeal or protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a bond of AUD\$200 to the event secretary. No bond is required to protest relating to abuse. If a protest is to be lodged it must be within 30 minutes from the posting of final scores in accordance with Annexe F 15(d) and Rule 7.14 © of the EA National Dressage Rules.

Medication Control

This event will be run in accordance with the current EA Medication Control Policy and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

Conditions of Entry

Applicable Equestrian Australia (EA) Documents and Requirements

This Equestrian Victoria (EV) event is governed by the Equestrian Australia (EA) General Regulations, applicable EA Sports Rules and all relevant EA Codes, policies, bylaws, rules and regulations.
